- I understand the deferral fee must be paid within 30 days of my deferral being granted. Payments can be made online at <u>www.cityofwest.com</u> or by mailing a cashier's check or money order payable to City of West. Personal checks will not be accepted.
- I understand that if I successfully complete the terms of the Deferred Disposition in a timely manner, my case will be dismissed.
- If I do not successfully complete the terms of the Deferred Disposition, I will receive a notice to appear in court to show cause why I did not complete the terms of Deferred Disposition as ordered.
- I understand that if I do not show sufficient cause, the Deferred Disposition will be revoked and a judgement of guilty entered and may be reported to the Texas Department of Public Safety in accordance with Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Art. 27.14(c).
